The role ensures that all investigative activities are performed within the jurisdiction of the Office of the Auditor-General to protect public resources.

MAIN DUTIES AND OUTCOMES:

- 1.1 Develop detailed investigation plans including scope, resource requirements, and evidence/witness matrixes
- 1.2 Conduct preliminary assessments of allegations to determine merit and priority levels
- 1.3 Gather, analyze, and secure documentary, testimonial, and analytical evidence
- 1.4 Perform witness and suspect interviews in strict accordance with the OAG Investigation Manual
- 2.1 Draft high-quality investigative reports detailing the methodology of fraud, estimated monetary loss, and responsible parties
- 2.2 Prepare Affidavit to support Search Warrant applications and Criminal case filings
- 2.3 Provide expert testimony during court proceedings and administrative hearings

- 3.1 Maintain a complete and updated registry of all fraud allegations reported via hotlines, referrals, or audit contractors
- 3.2 Prepare referrals for administrative discipline to appropriate authorities in compliance with the Audit Act
- 3.3 Contribute to Public awareness and fraud prevention initiatives led by the OAG
- 4.1 Other Duties as Assigned
