MAIN DUTIES AND OUTCOMES:

- 1.1 Define Technology Strategy & Employment Announcement; through the Technical Advisory Group and the AOGG policy setting requirements
- 2.1 Publish/ Enforce standards & secure-by-design patterns; run reviews/ stage gates, in collaboration with the Cyber (CISO) and Data (CDO)
- 3.1 Own shared platforms, SLAs, lifecycle and fin-ops (Cloud cost framework for Government)
- 4.1 Lead Technical evaluation/business cases; align donor investments to the government priorities
- 5.1 Reduce Legacy risk; coordinate DR/BCP; lead technical response to incidents, in alignment with the Security (CSIRT) and Data policies and practice
- 6.1 Set technical criteria; manage vendor performance; ensure knowledge transfer, and aid procurement activities for all of government contract
- 7.1 Advise Chief Secretary/ Cabinet; engage donors/partners; represent RMI in regional Digital and technical fora
- 8.1 Establish and Operationalize whole-of-Government technical governance structures under the TAG and AOGG, including clear decision rights and assurance processes
- 9.1 Oversee and report on the technical components of the Government's Digital and Technology Plan
- 10.1 Create the foundational catalogue of standards, interoperability requirements, and secure-by-design principles
- 11.1 Review and approve major ICT architectures, procurements, and project designs across Ministries
- 12.1 Define roles, career pathways, and deliver training to build in-country capability
- 13.1 Provide a whole-of-government view of all digital and technology initiatives, including project performance, risk, and benefits realization, to support AOGG oversight
- 14.1 Incorporate sector-specific components and priorities into the plan to ensure it reflects whole-of-government needs and future-proofed technical director, and drive procurement reform through the standardization of technology requirements, evaluation criteria, and assurance processes
- 15.1 To assist in the development and implementation of programs to strengthen the planning. Development and administration of policy development through workshops, conferences, forums and other GRMI events initiated by the Cabinet or the Chief Secretary
- 16.1 To undertake any other task consistent with the role as assigned by the Chief Secretary

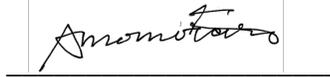
