2. Providing Culturally Appropriate Health Education and Information
3. Care Coordination, Case Management, and System Navigation
4. Advocating for Individuals and Communities
5. Providing Direct Service and Outreach
6. Implementing Individual and Community Assessments

**MAIN DUTIES AND OUTCOMES:**

- 1.1 Navigating patients from the community to hospital
- 2.1 Attend any refresher course conducted to upgrade skill and knowledge
- 2.2 Provide basic health education and screening among community members
- 3.1 Assist during any health community visits
- 3.2 Provide initial support for survivors of GBV in communities and initiate GBV referral
- 4.1 Encourage and bring pregnant mothers to attend prenatal care early
- 5.1 Assist in pandemic efforts including quarantine and mental health shelter
- 5.2 Encourage and bring pregnant mothers to attend parental care early
- 6.1 Better representation of community in health plans/decision
- 6.2 Better health services and information access by the community members


