JOB PURPOSE: The forestry officer will work under the overall guidance of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Commerce and under the direct supervision of the Chief of Forestry and Agriculture. The officer will also help the Agriculture and Forestry division implement projects in collecting sample data on forest types in the Marshall Islands.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Collect and Compile forestry project data
2. Support site selection, replanting, and plan propagation activities
3. Maintain and update nursery records
4. Manage nursery operations for food trees and root crops
5. Distribute planting material and provide community- level technical support
6. Monitor plan health and apply pest/disease treatments
7. Assist with logistical arrangements for fieldwork and trainings
8. Conduct community outreach and assessments for forestry programs
9. Support installation of forest inventory plots with local authorities
10. Perform other forestry and agriculture duties as assigned.

MAIN DUTIES AND OUTCOMES:

- 1.1 Work with NRC and the Forestry Program to develop a questionnaire to gather information on food tree resources in outer island communities with FIA plots nearby.
- 1.2 Provide results of the assessment on the FIA (Forest Inventory and Analysis) program under the Forestry Division.
- 2.1 Prior to field or forestry operations, conduct community information and outreach meetings to inform local landowners of planned activities and address concerns.

2.2 Help arrange ground transportation on Majuro, boat transportation to/from outer islands, and other logistics for fieldwork and ground control establishment.

3.1 Assist with logistical support for training or workshops, including demonstration activities for forest inventory data gathering.

3.2 Assist in organizing and conducting training in outer islands as assigned

4.1 Support field demonstrations, nursery operation, and propagation processes as required.

4.2 Gather additional data on forest inventory to supplement nursery and propagation work.

5.1 Conduct outreach to communities regarding the Forest Inventory Project

5.2 Administer community assessments about cultivar types and invasive species presence in the community.

6.1 Support obtaining permission for new forest inventory plots by coordinating with mayors and chiefs.

6.2 Assist in monitoring and addressing plant health issues as part of forest inventory and nursery operations.

7.1 Carry out additional duties related to forestry, agriculture, or project support as assigned.

7.2 Support government counterparts, implementing partners, and stakeholders as needed

8.1 Administer community assessments to gather information on food tree resources in targeted communities

8.2 Conduct outreach to communities to explain the Forest Inventory Project and address local questions

8.3 Administer assessments to identify the presence of invasive species within communities

9.1 Work with village mayors and chiefs to obtain permission for the installation of new forest inventory plots

9.2 Assist in establishing ground control for forest inventory work, including coordinating transportation to/from outer islands

10.1 Carry out other duties assigned by the Chief of Forestry and Agriculture

10.2 Support government counterparts, implementing partners, and stakeholders with logistical and field-related tasks

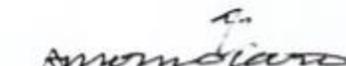
